Discipleship Cycle: Debrief & Interpret

Last week's Debrief & Interpret question was:

"Most of the stories about expansive intimacy shared in the sermon were from everyday, ordinary experiences, like praying with a friend during the commute to work, and inviting a Lifegroup community to help pack for a move. Is there a small way you can more deeply invite a friend or someone in your community into the life you already have this week, by sharing an easy meal, running errands together, meeting at a park with your kids, etc.?"

What did that look like for you this week?

Quick Review: What stood out to you from this week's passage?

Looking back at your notes from this week's passage and sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged or confused you?

My Story

- 1) This Sunday's passage addressed some of the church's messages about sex and sexuality. What were some of the messages you received from your family or from the church that helped or harmed your understanding of sex?
- 2) What deeper impacts did you see those messages play in your self-understanding? In your understanding of others?
- 3) How does our calling as Saints (1 Cor. 1:2-4) impact how we understand our bodies and our calling as disciples of Christ? What is the difference between believing in our identity as Saints and understanding our *behavior* as the thing that makes us pure or impure?
- 4) How does the physical act of sex express the God-given desire to know and be known? What happens when we separate our sexuality from our spirituality?
- 5) How is a marriage covenant intended to reflect the love of Christ? How is sex a part of that?
- 6) What does it look like for us as a church to connect with and include those who are single and don't want to be? How can we hold space for lament with them as they long for a romantic partner, even while we include them in other kinds of intimate knowing as a community?

Dive Deeper

*Faith: What is this passage asking me to believe about God or myself?

If you're married and it feels safe to do so, initiate sex with your partner as a way to express your commitment this week. Tell them how deeply you love them and share one thing about them that reflects Christ's love to you.
